MINUTES FOR JUNE 8, 2015

BOARD OF CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS

CONVENE

Commissioner Napier called the regular session of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners (The Board), to order and led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance at 9:00 AM on Monday, June 8, 2015 in the Commission Room, #109 of the Cherokee County Courthouse located at 110 W Maple St., Columbus, Kansas. Commissioners Charles Napier, and Pat Collins were present. Commissioner Richard Hilderbrand was absent as well as County Clerk Rodney Edmondson. Susan Jones from the County Clerk's Office was present for the purpose of taking the minutes.

Jason Allison - Emergency Preparedness Director

He came before the Board and asked them to sign Resolution No. 09-2015. It was a Proclamation of a State of Local Disaster Emergency for Cherokee County, Kansas due to flooding from the recent heavy rains.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to pass Resolution No. 09-2015 for the purpose of road and bridge repair. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-0.

Brenda Clugston - Cherokee County Health Department

She came before the Board to ask them to sign several purchase orders. As mentioned in the June 1, 2015 Commissioner Meeting, they are receiving monies from the Lower 8 Regional Preparedness Funds of SE Kansas. The WIC Immunization Collaboration Project came up with an incentive to get shot for children up to age two. They want to purchase 15 tricycles that convert to bicycles as the children grow. They will purchase direct from the manufacturer so they can't be returned for a cash refund.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the Minutes of the BOCC Meeting for June 1, 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-0.

Leonard Vanatta - County Road Supervisor Gene Langerot - County Lot Supervisor

They appeared before the Board on routine county road business. They reported that they are not doing any black topping at this time. Commissioner Napier told them that they got a report of a road washing out at SW Quaker Rd and 50th St. Citizen Allen Moore is requesting a ditch be dug to remedy the situation and that the dirt be hauled to the Neutral-Moore Cemetery. They also talked about the need for several culvert repairs needed due to the recent flooding washouts.

Clark Hall - Cherokee County Extension Office

He explained to the Board that they have been able to save up enough money to purchase another vehicle as well as maintain their building repairs. He also presented their 2016 budget and stated that they are requesting the exact same mill levy in 2016 and they received in 2015. A copy of the budget was given to the County Clerk.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to accept the County Extension Budget to be extended from 2015 to 2016. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-0.

Dan Robison - Citizen

He came before the Board asking for repairs to be done on a two mile stretch of Scammon Rd. between 70th and 90th Streets. The road was black topped several years back, but is now getting a lot of pots holes due to the large amount of heavy equipment going over it. He fears the threat of the county getting a lot of vehicle repair bills due to the numerous pot holes. The Board will get with the County Lot to get this situation resolved.

Commissioner Collins made a motion to amend the agenda for John Green from 11:00 AM to 10:44 AM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-0.

John Green - SEK Area for Aging

He came before the Board with their 2016 budget request of \$7,000.00, which is the same that was requested and approved for 2015. A copy of the budget was given to the County Clerk. He announced that they are seeking two new board members due to recent vacancies, and welcomed any suggestions from the Board. He also announced that he will be retiring on July 1, 2015 and is being replaced by Cindy Lane.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to accept the SEK Area for Aging Budget to be extended from 2015 to 2016. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-0.

Commissioner Collins made a motion to adjourn until the next regularly scheduled meeting set for June 15, 2015 at 9:00 AM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-0 with all voting yes at 11:40 AM.

PROCLAMATION of a State of Local Disaster Emergency for Cherokee County, Kansas:

WHEREAS on the day of June, 2015 ine Board of Commissioners of Cherokee County, Kansas finds that certain conditions have caused, or eminently threaten to cause wide-spread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property in disaster property proportion in Cherokee County, Kansas.

WHEREAS, such conditions have created obstructions which endanger health, safety, and welfare of persons and property within the border of Cherokee County, Kansas.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Cherokee County, Kansas.

That the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County, Kansas, under and by virtue of the authority vested in it by K.S.A. 1976 Supp. 48-932, does hereby PROCLAIM that a State of Local Disaster Emergency exists.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND PROCLAIMED that the area within the border of Cherokee County, Kansas covered by this proclamation/resolution is the entire area of Cherokee County, Kansas.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Board has all rights and/or powers to perform such functions as are vested in said Board by and through the provisions of the Kansas Emergency Preparedness Act of 1975.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND PROCLAIMED that this resolution shall remain in effect for a period of seven (7) days unless terminated earlier or renewed by consent of the governing body.
