MINUTES FOR MARCH 12, 2012

COLUMBUS, KANSAS, CHEROKEE COUNTY

OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK

The Cherokee County Commissioners met March 12, 2012. Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted by County Clerk Crystal Gatewood with no changes for March 5, 2012; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Signing off on the approved minutes were Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand and Collins, and Cherokee County Clerk Gatewood. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve and pay March 2012 Mid-Month Accounts Payables; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner, with Commissioners Garner, Collins and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Commissioners Garner, Collins and Hilderbrand, and Clerk Gatewood signed off on the documentation. Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins, and Garner signed off on the Health Department Maternal Health Immunization Action Plan, WIC Immunization and State Formula documents, and Voucher # 6893 to PRO CT for their updated firewall in the amount of \$884.00.

EXECUTIVE SESSIONS CALLED BY COMMISSION

County Employee Barbara Sparks requested Executive Session for Personnel/Non Elected. Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into Executive Session for ten minutes for Personnel/Non Elected with himself, Commissioners Garner and Hilderbrand, and Barbara Sparks; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand, with Commissioners Collins, Garner and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went in at 9:20 AM and returned at 9:35 AM.

Commissioner Hilderbrand requested Executive Session for Personnel/Non Elected. Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into Executive Session for fifteen minutes for Personnel/Non Elected with himself and Commissioners Garner and Collins; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went in at 10:15 AM and returned at 10:30 AM.

Cherokee County Sheriff David Groves requested Executive Session for litigation. Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into Executive Session for litigation for five minutes with himself, Commissioners Hilderbrand and Garner, and Sheriff Groves; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went in tat 11:19 AM and returned at 11:27 AM.

County Counselor Kevin Cure requested Executive Session for Legal Advice on a Contractual Matter. Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into Executive Session for Legal Advice on a Contractual Matter for five minutes with himself, Commissioners Hilderbrand and Garner, and County Counselor Cure; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Collins and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went in at 11:30 AM and returned at 11:35 AM.

Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into Executive Session for thirty minutes for Attorney/Client Privilege regarding Pending Litigation with himself, Commissioners Garner and Hilderbrand, County Counselor Kevin Cure, Teresa Watson, and David Cooper; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner; with Commissioners Garner, Collins and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went in at 11:40 AM and returned 12:12 PM.

OTHER BUSINESS

Raymond Griffitt came before the commission to discuss a personal property problem. The commission again suggested he contact the Cherokee County Attorney.

Betty McBride, spokesman and member of the Treece Buyout Committee, and Bob Jurgens via - telephone with the state of Kansas, discussed the coordination with B-3 Construction and Cherokee County for the use of county dump trucks to haul the millings from Treece, Kansas. Jason and Lorie Johnson were present representing B-3 Construction, and the commission agreed to coordinate with them using twelve county dump trucks with county drivers to help in the hauling. They are planning to begin on March 26, 2012.

Linda Bilke of KSN news came before the commission to ask the commission to be an Event Sponsor for the "Four States Weather Stop" being conducted by KSN News, the cost to the county would be \$1,500.00. The commission said they would discuss it with Jason Allison, the Emergency Preparedness Director for the county, and have Jason get back to her. The commission thanked her for coming in. Attached to these minutes is the presentation given by Ms. Bilke.

Jason Allison of Emergency Preparedness came before the commission to give an update that the state wide tornado drill will be conducted March 13, 2012 at 1:30 PM. Blue Valley will be here on Tuesday to start setting up the sirens, and Jason will coordinate the installation. The commission also gave Jason the information on the KSN "Weather Stops" presented by Ms. Bilke, and Jason said that the city of Galena was already a sponsor for an event and he did not feel that Columbus would have enough participation in the event. The commission also questioned where the \$1,500.00 sponsor fee would come from.

Alan Mauk with Downstream Casino and the Quapaw Tribe came before the commission to ask for mutual cooperation regarding the casino parking lot being put in the trust for the tribe, which would make it a tax exempt property. The commission is opposed to the tax exemption and had County Counselor Cure write a letter. The letter was dated March 7, 2012 and requested a 30 day extension on the deadline for a response. Alan is meeting with USD 404 on Wednesday, March 14, 2012 to discuss the tribe's intentions. The commission thanked them for coming in.

MOTIONS MADE BY COMMISSION

Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to amend the Agenda and move Linda Bilke from 10:15 AM to 10:05 AM; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner; with Commissioners Garner, Collins and Hilderbrand voting in favor.

Commissioner Collins made a motion to sign and submit a the letter of support for SEK Area on the Aging to submit an application as a subcontractor, brought in by the Southeast Kansas Area on the Aging Director John Green; Commissioner Garner seconded the motion with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor and signing the letter. A copy of the letter is attached to these minutes.

ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Collins made a motion to adjourn at 12:13 PM; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Collins and Hilderbrand voting in favor. The next Cherokee County Commission meeting will be held March 19, 2012 at 9:00 AM in the Cherokee County Courthouse in Columbus, Kansas.
