MINUTES FOR DECEMBER 14, 2015

BOARD OF CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS

CONVENE

Chairman Napier called the regular session of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners (The Board), to order and led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance at 9:00 AM on Monday, December 14, 2015 in the Commission Room, #109 of the Cherokee County Courthouse located at 110 W Maple St., Columbus, Kansas. Commissioners Charles Napier, Pat Collins, Robert Myers, and County Clerk Rodney Edmondson were present.

Members of the press present: Larry Hiatt, Jordan Zabel, Machelle Smith, and Sarah Okeson

A motion was made by Commissioner Myers to approve the Minutes of the BOCC Meeting for December 7, 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the Payroll for the month of December, 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-1 with Commissioner Myers voting no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the Mid-Month Accounts Payables for December 8, 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Myers. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Myers to approve the Accounts Payable for the month of December, 2015, with the following exclusions. On page 7, item 89331; page 8, items 89260, 89261, and 89263; page 9, item 89136; page 18, item 89184; page 21, item 89326; and page 31, item 89371. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-1 with Commissioner Collins voting no.

County Treasurer Juanita Hodgson, and County Clerk Rodney Edmondson appeared before the Board regarding the County budget and fund balances for 2015. Hodgson provided budget and fund balance reports for the Board to review. County Appraiser Mark Hixon stated that he has an invoice in excess of \$29,000 that is not covered in his budget amendment because he doesn't have the funds to cover it. It will need to be paid for with County General Funds. Edmondson spoke with auditor Gene Mense and he has prepared the necessary documents to amend certain budgets for 2015. The Board will need to approve for publication of a "Notice of Public Hearing" to amend the budgets for Road & Bridge, Appraisal, and Ambulance.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve for publication the "Notice of Public Hearing" and to set a budget hearing for December 28, 2015 at 10:00 AM for the purpose of amending the necessary 2015 budgets. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Myers. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to authorize the County Treasurer to transfer \$140,000 from the Equipment Reserve Fund to the County General Fund. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 2-1 with Commissioner Myers voting no.

County Appraiser Mark Hixon reported that the Board of Tax Appeals has dismissed the appeal filed by the Galena Hospital for the tax years of 2013 and 2014 for lack of prosecution.

County Clerk Edmondson reported that the bi-weekly payroll schedule has been completed and will begin with the first pay day on January 15, 2016. The Board will need to approve pay on Wednesdays with pay issued on Friday for the months of January and February. Beginning in March the Board will approve on Mondays with pay days being on Wednesdays for the remainder of the year. There will be three times that the Board will need to approve on Friday due to holidays. A complete calendar is being prepared and will be provided to everyone soon.

County Clerk Edmondson reported that the complete bid notice for the Varck Sewer Lift Station project has been received from Shawn Turner. The notice of publication is in today's News Report.

A motion was made by Commissioner Myers to have the County Treasurer provide the Budget and Fund Balance Reports to the Board on the first Monday of each month for the previous month's activity beginning the first Monday in February, 2016. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Myers not to restock the first aid cabinets in any county department. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins. The motion carried 3-0. The Board asked Clerk Edmondson to see that Cintas is notified.

The Board requested that a memo be sent to the Department Heads regarding prior approval by the Board for all expenditures that go beyond daily office supplies.

Leonard Vanatta - County Road Supervisor Gene Langerot - County Lot Supervisor

They appeared before the Board on routine county road business. Gene presented an estimate for three used John Deere tractors with Diamond mowers from Murphy Tractor in Springfield. The Board took it under advisement.

A motion was made by Commissioner Napier to recess for 15 minutes, to reconvene at 10:10 AM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Myers. The motion carried 3-0 at 9:55 AM.

A motion was made by Commissioner Myers to enter an Executive Session with the Board and County Clerk Edmondson for the purpose of Non/Elected Personnel for a period of 15 minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins. The motion carried 3-0 at 10:31 AM.

The meeting reconvened at 10:46 AM.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to enter an Executive Session with the Board and County Clerk Edmondson for the purpose of Non/Elected Personnel for another 15 minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Myers. The motion carried 3-0 at 10:47 AM.

The meeting reconvened at 11:02 AM.

No action was taken as a result of the Executive Sessions.

Paul Rogers - Meals on Wheels

He appeared before the Board regarding the Columbus Meals on Wheels Program. He reported that SEK Senior Services is declaring bankruptcy. They are meeting tomorrow with SEK-AAA and their lawyer regarding what is owed to the First Christian Church.

Nathan Coleman - County Counselor

He appeared before the Board regarding legal matters concerning Cherokee County.

He informed the Board that briefs have been filed in the KRGC case and responses will now take place.

Judge Sam Marsh - District Court

He appeared before the Board to request remodeling or repairs in the courtroom. He stated that he would like to see the carpet removed and return to the tile floor if possible. He asked for the installation of solar shades on the windows and some electrical receptacles along the bar. The Board asked him to get bids on the work requested and get back with them.

Commissioner Myers made a motion to adjourn until the next regular meeting set for Monday, December 21, 2015 at 9:00 AM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins. The motion carried 3-0 at 11:55 AM.
