### **MINUTES FOR AUGUST 14, 2017**

#### **BOARD OF CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**

#### **CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS**

#### CONVENE

Chairman Collins called the regular session of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners (The Board), to order and led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, August 14, 2017 in the Commission Room, #109 of the Cherokee County Courthouse located at 110 W Maple St., Columbus, Kansas. Commissioners Pat Collins, Neal Anderson, Cory Moates, County Counselor Barbara Wright, and County Clerk Rodney Edmondson were present.

Members of the press present: Larry Hiatt, Jordan Zabel, and Francis Secrist

Commissioner Collins read a letter of support for the transportation providers of Coordinated Transit District #10 in their application to KDOT for funding assistance for the Board to consider. The letter was signed by the Board.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to approve the minutes of the August 7, 2017 BOCC meeting as written. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. The motion carried 3-0.

Leonard Vanatta, County Road Supervisor, and Louis Schreiner, County Lot Supervisor, appeared before the Board on routine county road business. Leonard presented an agreement between BNSF Railway Company, Cherokee County, and KDOT for the construction of highway crossing signals at the tracks located at Clem Rd. and SE 32<sup>nd</sup> St. Commissioner Collins asked him to check on Eldon Rd. just off of Highway 69 for damage that needs some repair. Commissioner Moates reminded him of the trees that need trimmed on the west side of Kansas Ave. in Baxter Springs. Commissioner Moates asked him to check on 75<sup>th</sup> St. where the culvert was repaired, it has developed a bump. Louis reported that one of the 2011 dump trucks is back from Freightliner with a remanufactured transmission.

Attorney Gene Barrett appeared before the Board regarding the pending tax sale. He stated that he anticipates filing the exhibit and petition with the court next week. Last week he was working on updating the parcel list and checking for liens against the properties. There are a little over 250 parcels that will be filed on. He stated that he would come back next Monday and let the Board know if the filing is ready. He suggested a few ways to possibly improve the collection of taxes. One would be to send a reminder notice, on County Attorney letter head that taxes weren't paid in December. The same type of letter could be sent after the second half payment is missed in May. He believes that letters from the County Attorney could draw more attention to the owners than a letter from the County Treasurer. Mr. Barrett stated that only an attorney can file a tax sale with the court. The title search can be done by anyone that knows what they are doing. But that information must be converted by the attorney to the proper documents that are acceptable by the court. This will be the first tax sale filing that will be done by e-filing with the court.

Larry Hiatt mentioned that Shawnee County is allowing taxes to be paid monthly. He stated that monthly or quarterly payments would possibly increase collections. He stated that December is a bad time to come up with half of your taxes.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to approve the payroll for the period ending August 4, 2017. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to approve the accounts payable for the period ending August 10, 2017. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. The motion carried 3-0.

Commissioner Moates made a motion to adjourn until the next regular meeting set for Monday, August 21, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 10:32 a.m.
